Background:

Established in 2005, AFENET is a non-profit networking and service alliance of Field Epidemiology (and Laboratory) Training Programs (FELTPs), and other applied epidemiology training programs. AFENET has operations in over 40 countries in sub-Saharan Africa, and five countries in the Caribbeans. AFENET is dedicated to helping Ministries of Health in Africa build strong, effective, sustainable programs and capacity to improve public health systems on the African continent. The network's goal is to strengthen Field epidemiology and public health laboratory capacity to contribute effectively to addressing epidemics and other major public health problems in countries where we operate.

The National Stop Transmission of Polio (NSTOP) program, one of AFENET's biggest projects, is a product of a collaboration between AFENET and the US CDC. It was established in July 2012 in response to the National Polio Eradication Emergency Plan to strengthen the Nigeria polio eradication program at the operational level. Implemented through the Nigeria Field Epidemiology and Laboratory Training Programme (NFELTP), the purpose of NSTOP is to provide Nigeria with high quality and culturally competent technical field support staff in high-risk areas to implement the polio eradication emergency plan and strengthen routine immunization.

Job Purpose:

The incumbent under the guidance of the NFELTP Resident Advisor will provide management oversight and leadership for NSTOP in liaison with CDC GID leadership based in Atlanta and Nigeria and the AFENET secretariat in Kampala, Uganda.

Major duties and responsibilities:

The NSTOP National Coordinator shall;

- Provide strategic and technical support to all NSTOP program areas
- Participate in the design and conduct of trainings for the NSTOP assignees
- Participate in the selection of NSTOP Consultants
- Participate in the selection of deployment sites for the NSTOP Consultants
- Conduct bi-monthly supervisory and capacity building visits with each NSTOP assignee
- Monitor and evaluate Field work of NSTOP assignees through routine phone and email communication and site visits in their States of assignment.
- Provide logistic and technical support to STOP Field coordinators and assignees
- Foster inter-agency collaboration, partnership on communication on NSTOP and other polio vaccine-preventable diseases.
- Provide updates to the inter-agency team on key activities and outcomes on NSTOP assignees.
- Represent NSTOP Program in meetings with Government and partners
- Provide monthly reports to CDC-GID Project Officer on summary of activities
- Prepare Quarterly reports for NSTOP inter-agency partnership.
- Prepare adhoc reports and presentations for meetings as required
- Assist with development and monitor implementation of protocols prepared by NSTOP assignees.
- Supervise, mentor and evaluate Abuja NSTOP staff, including the Graduate Advisors and the Administrator.

Academic requirements:

- Minimum of a Master of Public Health in Field Epidemiology is preferred. A Master's in Project Planning and Management and advanced training in Vaccinology are an added advantage.
- A minimum of 10 years' experience serving in a similar leadership position in a reputable Organization.
- At least 5 years of prior work experience on immunization activities preferably polio eradication or related public health programs working in collaboration with NGOs, UN organizations, Government agencies or Ministries.



- Chartered Membership to professional organizations and possession of relevant Chartered certifications a must.
- Proven Knowledge of US Government Rules and Regulations is a must.

Knowledge requirements

- Experience in working with the Nigeria EPI program
- Knowledge and experience in the issues of consequential geography,
- Expertise in routine immunization, polio eradication, and Vaccine-Preventable Disease surveillance, plus proven project management skills.
- Knowledge and understanding of local government structures and primary health care systems in Nigeria
- Experience working or interacting with nomadic, hard-to-reach, and/or other migrant communities will be an advantage
- Knowledge and experience on strategies to reach areas with insecurity with immunization services will be an added advantage.
- Knowledge of standard computer software packages with experience in MS Word, MS Excel spreadsheets, MS PowerPoint

- Demonstrated project planning and management skills for organizing, planning and executing projects from conception through implementation.
- Excellent leadership skills include the capacity to organize people to achieve a shared goal.
