## **Background:**

The African Field Epidemiology Network (AFENET) is a non-profit organization established in 2005 with a mission to improve human health through the strengthening and expansion of applied epidemiology and laboratory capacity in partnership with Ministries of Health, Non-Governmental Organizations, international agencies, private sector and other public health agencies. AFENET has its headquarters in Kampala, Uganda with operations in more than 30 African Countries.

The African Union, established as a unique Pan African continental body, is charged with spearheading Africa's rapid integration and sustainable development by promoting unity, solidarity, cohesion and cooperation among the peoples of Africa and African States as well as developing a new partnership worldwide. Its headquarters is located in Addis Ababa, capital city of Ethiopia.

The Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC) was officially launched in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on January 31, 2017. The Africa CDC is Africa's first continent-wide public health agency and envisions a safer, healthier, integrated and stronger Africa, where Member States are capable of effectively responding to outbreaks of infectious diseases and other public health threats. The agency mission is to strengthen Africa's public health institutions' capabilities to detect and respond quickly and effectively to disease outbreaks and other health burdens through an integrated network of continent-wide preparedness and response, surveillance, laboratory, and research programmes.



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The Saving Lives and Livelihoods (SLL) program is a strategic partnership among Africa CDC, the African Union Member States, and the Mastercard Foundation. The main objective of the programme during Phase I was to acquire vaccines against COVID-19 and to vaccinate vulnerable groups as a priority, while reaching millions of other people across the continent. The program also laid the foundations for local vaccine production in Africa, with a particular focus on human capital development and capacity building at Africa CDC. In Phase II of the programme, the partnership has revised its objectives, with a focus on geo-mapping, vaccination of health workers and priority groups, and integrating COVID-19 management into routine immunization. Additionally, the initiative aims to prepare for future pandemics by investing in genomic sequencing, enhancing bioinformatics laboratories, supporting local vaccine, therapeutic, and diagnostic manufacturing, and strengthening the Africa CDC's capacity.

## Job Purpose

The Technical Officer for Risk Communication and Community Engagement will support the emergency preparedness and response for public heath emergencies. It is a cornerstone of the International Health Regulations (IHR) core capacities, aimed at strengthening public health emergency preparedness and response. RCCE is an essential approach that effectively educates individuals and communities about healthy behaviors, while preventing the spread of infectious diseases during public health emergencies.

#### **Major Duties and Responsibilities:**

**Technical Officer for Risk Communication and Community Engagement** will:

• **Strategy Development**: Develop and implement RCCE strategies and plans to support emergency preparedness and response efforts across Africa. Ensure strategies are tailored to specific public health risks and are culturally relevant.



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- **Community Engagement**: Facilitate community engagement activities, working closely with local leaders, community groups, and stakeholders to design participatory response strategies during public health emergencies.
- **Media and Public Messaging**: Develop and disseminate accurate, consistent, and timely public health messages through multiple platforms, including media, digital platforms, and community networks. Ensure that public health messaging is clear, factual, and reaches diverse populations.
- Capacity Building and Technical Assistance: Provide technical assistance to African Union Member States to strengthen their RCCE capacities. Conduct training sessions and workshops to enhance the RCCE skills of public health professionals and community leaders
- **Stakeholder Coordination**: Coordinate with national governments, regional bodies, international partners, and civil society organizations to ensure the alignment and effectiveness of RCCE interventions during public health crises.
- Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E): Establish M&E frameworks to assess the impact of RCCE activities, collecting and analyzing data to inform continuous improvement of RCCE strategies. Provide reports on RCCE activities, highlighting key outcomes and areas for enhancement.
- **Crisis Communication**: Respond rapidly during public health emergencies to address misinformation and rumours, ensuring accurate information is disseminated to the public.
- Documentation and Reporting: Regularly document RCCE activities and prepare reports for Africa CDC leadership, outlining key successes, challenges, and recommendations for future interventions

## Qualification and work experience required

Bachelor's Degree in Public Health, Communication, Social Sciences, Behavioral Sciences or related fields and a minimum of 5 years of relevant work experience. Proven experience designing and implementing RCCE strategies during public health emergencies. Experience working in an African or international context, preferably in a public health-related role.

OR

Master's Degree in Public Health, Communication, Social Sciences, Behavioral Sciences or related fields and a minimum of 2 years relevant work experience. Proven experience designing and implementing RCCE strategies during public health emergencies. Experience working in an African or international context, preferably in a public health-related role.

- Experience in developing and implementing communication strategies for national government or public sector, regional or international government or non-governmental organisations, multinational organisations, advertising agencies or leading media companies will be a distinct advantage.
- Demonstrated ability with regard to computer skills, including excellent word processing capabilities, proficiency with e-mail and internet applications, experience in using office software such as MS Power Point, Word and Excel

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The appointment will be made on a fixed term contract for a period of one (1) year, of which the first three months will be considered as a probationary period. Thereafter, the contract will be renewed annually subject to satisfactory performance and fund availability.
